- 2 Compensation information is self reported. Of accepted offers, 97.1% included salary information. Of those, 10.5% reported receiving no salary. Salary data represents students who reported salary information and were paid a salary. Of reported paid and unpaid salaries, 12.2% were expected to be supplemented by the Yale SOM Internship Fund, a donor-supported fund that provides financial support to students who pursue summer internships in the public or nonprofit sector. This funding is not included in the salary data.
- 3 One hundred percent of accepted offers included job function, job industry, and region.
