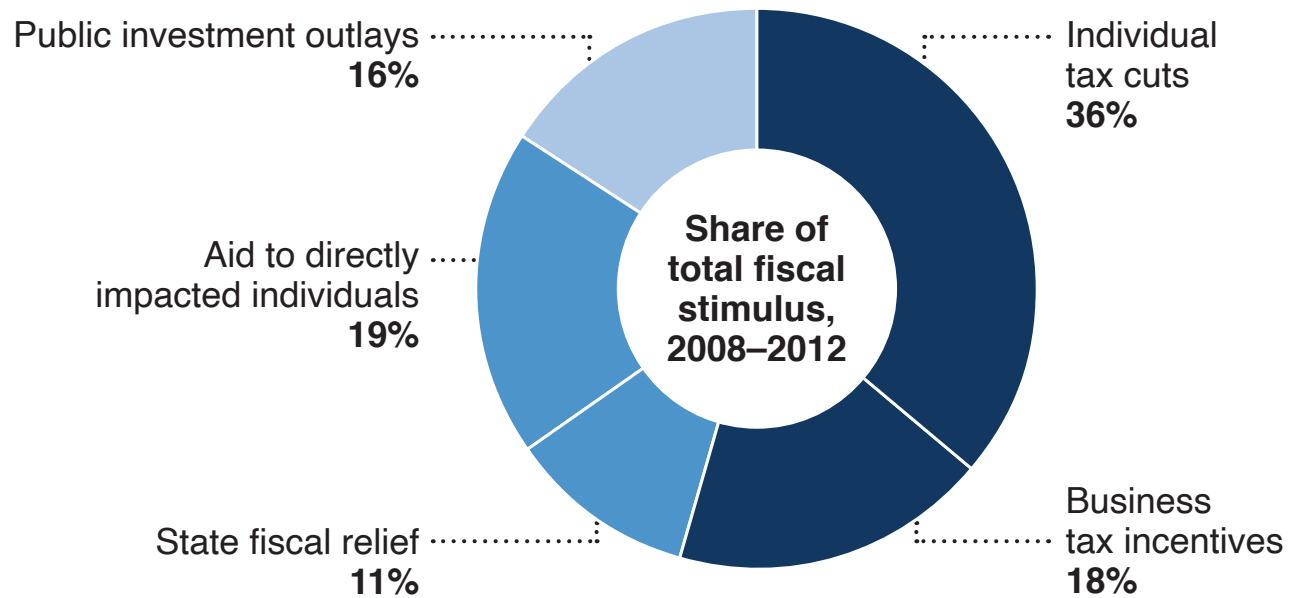


## Recovery Act and Prior and Subsequent Fiscal Measures, by Functional Category
